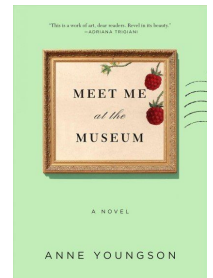

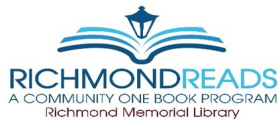

## 2019 Richmond Reads *Southernmost* by Silas House

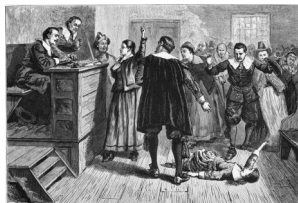
